**RE: PASSING OF RONALD PETER REMMERS**

**On behalf of the Board of Trustees, it's with deep sorrow that we announce that our Managing Trustee and Founder of the APIGIS Trust, Ronald Peter Remmers, has passed away on Monday, 13 April 2020.**

---

Ronald obtained his B Arch at the University of Pretoria in 1975, and his MSc (Town and Regional Planning) at the University of Pretoria in 1979. Since 1999 he has been in partnership with Clause Schutte: the registered company being "Remmers and Schutte Architects and Town Planners".

He has served on regional architectural committees since 1992, the first being the Transvaal Institute of Architects and he was President of the Pretoria Institute for Architecture 2003 / 2004 period.

Ronald initiated the establishment of the APIGIS Trust in 1999 and has served as Managing Trustee. He has accomplished his vision of creating a channel where individual architects could join forces to enable better bargaining power and benefits within the PI market.

His participation and liaison with the Scheme Managers and Underwriters has enabled him to obtain a wealth of knowledge relating specifically to the PI market and Architectural Practices, and the changes that have taken place at government level. The Trust has stood the test of time with the support of the SA Institute of Architects and the Regional Institutes.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to his family, friends and colleagues. His legacy will continue within the Architectural Industry where he firmly left his footprints. He will be greatly missed.
