The School's core activity is the provision of an excellent learning environment towards accredited professional degrees in architecture, planning, and related fields. The School supports the quality of its degrees through engagement in research and professional practice in these fields.

The University is seeking suitably qualified and experienced persons in architecture. The Architecture Programme is specifically looking to recruit persons who can teach in advanced building construction, advanced design studio and digital architectural communication, and who therefore have the relevant practice experience. The preference is for persons who are able to provide leadership, inspired teaching and research in the field, promoting sustainable thinking and diversity. The University is prepared to consider candidates at various levels of appointment, and is interested in the appointment of more than one candidate.

Preference will be given to recruiting Employment Equity candidates. Appointments can be made on a part-time up to a full-time basis (50%-100%), depending on the desired time percentage from suitable candidates.

Qualifications and experience: For all advertised posts: Practice and/or university teaching experience is a requirement. For Design and Construction posts: Practice experience in the design and construction of complex, multi-storey buildings is a requirement. For Digital Architectural Communication: Experience and training in various media (eg 3D Modelling, AutoCad, Film, Rapid Prototyping Tools, Revit, and manufacturing technology) is a requirement.

Lecturer/Senior Lecturer: For appointment at this level an earned doctoral degree, or a minimum of Master of Architecture (M Arch) and a publications record will be advantageous. Candidates should have between 3 and 10 years' practice experience, an accredited professional qualification in Architecture, good teaching experience and a research record.

The level of appointment will depend upon qualifications, professional registration, extent of experience and level of professional standing.

Duties: At the higher levels of appointment, an appointee will contribute to the development of the professional discipline; ensure the delivery of appropriate teaching inputs; conduct research; supervise postgraduate students; contribute to the administrative functioning of the school and perform such other duties as assigned by the Head of School. At lecturing levels of appointment, an appointee will teach normal number of hours in the School (depending on the percentage at which appointed); be active in research, writing, publishing and/or creative work and will be expected to undertake a share of administrative duties.
